Are you looking for solutions to alleviate these common issues?

- 1) Registration is an exhaustive process that involves many people
- 2) Parents are not aware of the programs offered
- 3) An online payment process does not exist
- 4) Potential or new partner organizations are not aware that they can contribute to support low cost or free programming

Tong Guan founded the **Do What U Luv** organization and created an online platform to remediate these issues. As a young person his personal circumstances required him to attend over 10 elementary schools. As an adult he is acutely aware of the critical role that after school programs played in his life. He wants to support young people to have opportunities to build friendships, explore interests, and connect with supportive adults.

Do What U Luv has been a key partner for the Coquitlam School District and their Community Schools Department. This partnership has resulted in a significant increase in opportunities for children and youth to participate in out-of-school time programs. These are some quotes shared by key stakeholders:

Ethos Lab is a virtual and in-person space for teens 12-18 to discover, explore, and develop through S.T.E.A.M and culture based experiences.


