On behalf of ACEbc, our executive find it important to acknowledge that we are gathering for this conference on Building Bridges: Equity, Diversity and Inclusion in Schools on the traditional and unceded territory of the <u>ģićəý</u> (Katzie) First Nation who have been stewards and protectors of this land since time immemorial.

The Katzie people have lived and thrived on their land for thousands of years. They maintain deep connections to their land, rivers, sloughs, creeks and wetlands - at the center of this territory is sq́əýćəya?t xăca? (The lake of the Katzie) and sq́əýćəya?t státləw (the river of the Katzie). What is now known as Pitt Meadows, Maple Ridge, Surrey, Langley and Delta, the Katzie have ancient names for all of these places where their ancestors lived, worked, learned and transformed.

As educators and community school coordinators gathering from various territories that have been unceded, we acknowledge the power of transformation that can occur when we commit to truth, reconciliation and decolonization. Part of that process is understanding, living in, and building community.

The Tewa scholar Gregory Cajete (2015) wrote: "The community is where the individual 'forms the face and heart' as one of 'the People'...The community is the place for feeling and being connected, for belonging. The community is the place where each person can, metaphorically speaking, become complete and express the fullness of their life."

With that wisdom in mind, we acknowledge that we seek, through our conference, to transform ourselves and our communities to become places for feeling, being connected and for belonging. Places where our students and educators can continue to form and re-form our faces and hearts. We thank the Katzie nation on whose land we gather on, for their commitment and continued protection of the land.

CHRISTINE MACKENZIE

Steps Forward: Christine Mackenzie

Join Christine Mackenzie, facilitator and Artist from the Kwakiutl Nation, for this interactive workshop, where we will explore decolonization by examining internal biases and the impact of systemic inequities. Through discussions, reflection, and storytelling, participants will learn to create culturally safe, inclusive spaces. We'll also examine the "masks" we wear in personal and professional settings, exploring how they shape interactions. A key focus is recognizing our own mental health needs while supporting vulnerable communities. By the end, participants will:

- Connect decolonization, equity, and cultural safety
- Identify biases that hinder inclusivity
- Learn strategies for fostering equitable environments
- Prioritize self-care in community work



BETH APPLEWHITE

Anti-racism: Beth Applewhite

Beth Applewhite is an unapologetic anti-racist and has dedicated her professional life to educational justice initiating professional development work in Education Systems. Beth advocates for honest discourse, diverse voice, and an increased awareness of dominant culture, and the need to face both explicit and implicit biases. She will use lived experiences to inform our practice and enlighten participants about the long-reaching effects of discrimination. Her presentations and workshops are explicit, thought provoking and interactive. Beth does not shame and blame; instead she meets participants where they are at with compassion and understanding. She moves beyond definitions and awareness to honest personal reflection and authentic personal goals. Beth creates accountable spaces for participants to reflect on their learning/unlearning, share experiences and "try on" new perspectives. Participant voice will be encouraged, appreciated, and respected.

-Embracing our own identities and recognizing how they enhance our ability to support 2SLGBTQIA+ students -Defining the identities highlighted in the 2SLGBTQIA+ acronym

-Developing inclusive language

-Creating safe spaces to have sensitive conversations regarding SOGI and 2SLGBTQIA+ concerns and issues -Understanding how SOGI can show up in Community Schools Programming

-Learning what compassionate allyship looks like
